



Mountain Uhud

Mount Uhud gained historical significance through the pivotal Battle of Uhud in 625 CE, a major conflict between the early Muslim community and their adversaries. Despite encountering challenges, the battle showcased the resilience and bravery of the Muslim forces. Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) played a central role in this battle, strategically stationing archers on the mountain to protect the rear of the Muslim army as instructed. Mountain Rumah, Orchard Mountain

Rumah Mountain, situated near Mount Uhud in Madinah, holds great historical significance and is frequently visited by tourists. Its connection to the Battle of Uhud, which took place in the third year of the Islamic calendar, enhances its historical appeal. During this battle, Prophet Muhammad strategically positioned archers on Rumah Mountain to defend against an army led by the Quraysh tribe, who sought retribution for their losses in the Battle of Badr. Despite initial success, a miscommunication among the archers resulted in a tragic outcome. Disregarding the Prophet's orders, they descended prematurely, allowing the attackers, led by Khalid bin Al-Walid, to regroup and inflict significant casualties on the Muslim forces. Over 70 companions of the Prophet, including his uncle, Hamzah bin Abdul-Muttalib, lost their lives and were buried at the base of Rumah Mountain, Today, visitors, including Muslims, pay respects to the graves of the fallen companions and ascend the mountain to reflect on the historic battlefield.
























Masjid e Qiblatayn

Masjid Qiblatayn, meaning "The Mosque of Two Qiblas," is a significant landmark in Islamic history. It is the place where, during a prayer led by Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.), the direction of prayer (Oibla) changed from Jerusalem to Makkah following a divine revelation.

This event is referenced in the Qur'an (Surah Al-Bagarah 2:144) and marks a turning point in the spiritual journey of the Muslim ummah. The Prophet's immediate response to Allah's command reflects his unwavering obedience and submission to divine will.

Today, Masjid Qiblatayn stands as a powerful symbol of the adaptability of Islamic practices and the leadership of the final messenger, offering a profound reminder of faith, direction, and devotion.





















Khandaq Battle Field

The Khandag Battlefield, also known as the Battle of the Trench, took place in 627 CE as a strategic defense by the early Muslim community in Medina. Facing a coalition of pagan and Jewish tribes. Muslims—under the leadership of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.)—dug a trench around the vulnerable parts of the city, a tactic inspired by Persian strategy.

This brilliant move prevented the enemy from invading Medina and highlighted the Prophet's wisdom and the community's unity. The battle brought together the Muhajirin (immigrants from Makkah) and the Ansar (residents of Medina), emphasizing the strength of Muslim solidarity in the face of a common threat.























Saba Masjid

Saba Masjid, also known as the Seven Masjids, is a group of small, historic mosques located on the western side of Mount Sala' in the sacred city of Medina, Although the name 'Saba' means seven, the site today consists of six masiids, each carrying deep historical and spiritual significance.

These masjids are situated near the location where the Muslims dug a trench during the Battle of the Trench (Ghazwat al-Khandag). under the guidance of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.), as a defensive strategy to protect Medina from the Quraysh and their allies. Each mosque is believed to mark the area where key commanders and companions were stationed during the battle.

The site stands as a powerful reminder of the courage, unity, and faith of the early Muslim community, making it a place of deep reflection and historical reverence for visitors and pilgrims alike.


























Masjid e Jummah


























Masjid e Quba

It is also the hallowed site where congregational Friday the prayer (Salah) Prophet Muhammad. companions, bv his Muhajireen (Muslims of Makkah) and the Ansar (Muslims of Madinah), Masjid Quba has undergone multiple renovations by and different caliphs, rulers governments since its initial construction.
